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The reported birthplace of Jesus

Bethlehem

But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting. Micah 5:2

Shechem, Bethel, Jerusalem, Bethlehem, and Hebron on a north-south route. Near Bethlehem, a major route crossed east to west, leading down to the desert. Bethlehem's location at the edge of the desert made it a meeting place for farmers, shepherds, and the nomadic peoples of the desert. In Hebrew "Bethlehem" means "House of Bread." In Arabic, it means "House of Meat."

The rural setting gives Bethlehem a special, pastoral atmosphere. Church steeples, visible from far distances, add to the city's charm and act as a content reminder of the many important events that occurred in this area.

The Church of the Nativity was a favorite place to visit until several years ago. It was built above the grotto of the nativity in which Jesus was born. In the eastern side of the grotto is a circular recess, containing a large silver star which designates the spot where it has been determined that Jesus was born. The star has 14 points and is inscribed which translated: "Here Jesus Christ Was Born Of The Virgin Mary." Above the star is a remnant of a crusader mosaic depicting the revelation of the birth. Next to the circular recess is the Holy Manger. The manger is hewn out of stone and covered with marble strips. Next to the altar is an altar devoted to the three wise men who saw the star in the east and came to worship the baby Jesus. This is also described in Matthew 2:1-11.

The first church was built above the Grotto of the Nativity in the fourth century A.D. by the Roman Emperor Constantine. Though his edict, he proclaimed Christianity a legal religion in the Roman Empire and thereby sanctioned Christian worship. Constantine and his Mother, Helena, built a majestic church adorned with mosaics, frescoes, and beautiful marble.

It was a wonderful afternoon, considering that it was not a very safe area to travel to, if you remember Pastor Clark prayed for my safety. I continue to pray for the Jewish people that I was blessed to have met, and pray for the upcoming March CCBF trip to Israel.

No one has had a greater impact upon the world than Jesus of Nazareth. Although He was born to a peasant family, throughout history, billions of people have referred to Him as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. He came into the world at a crucial time and place. According to the Gospel of Luke, an angel appeared to Mary in Nazareth and announced that God had chosen her to be the mother of the Messiah.

In the final days of pregnancy, Joseph and Mary traveled to Bethlehem to register according to a decree from the Emperor Augustus. While they were there, Mary gave birth to a son and laid Him in a feeding trough for animals. As directed, they named him "Jesus" because He would save His people for their sins. Luke 2:1-7 beautifully describes the birth of Jesus. I have enjoyed the above Scripture for many years, so it is not surprising that I ventured into Bethlehem one afternoon last month, after volunteering at Calvary Chapel Jerusalem for the month of October.

Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus, lies to the south of Jerusalem. It has its own special character and is of great historic importance. It is the hometown of David. Here, Samuel anointed David to be King of Israel (1 Samuel 16:1-13). According to the prophet Micah, one day God would raise up a ruler to lead the people of Israel from Bethlehem (Micah 5:2). Rachel, Jacob's wife and one of the four matriarchs of Israel, is buried in the territory of Bethlehem (Genesis 35:19). The story of Ruth, the Moabite, the great grandmother of King David, unfolds in the fields around the Bethlehem. Clearly, Bethlehem ranks as a significant site for the stories of the Old Testament. I believe those were my thoughts, or my excuse for traveling into an area that is not included on tours of Israel any longer.

Bethlehem is located on the mountain road which from ancient times, linked the main hilltop cities of Samaria,





The Body of Christ and The Gifts and High Calling of God

“For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable.”

Romans 11:29

How many times have you heard someone say, “I have been called to do this job?” Have you wondered, “What is he talking about? Did God stick His head down out of heaven and say, “Hey Joe, I want you to go to Africa to minister to the people of Kenya!” Or what about the person who says, “I have the gift of helps or hospitality.” Does God really call and gift people for the ministry? Most Christians would agree that their pastor and at least some of the elders in their church were called and equipped by God for their positions. But what would you say if I told you that God’s word states that ALL have been given a gift (1Cor. 12:7) and are called to use it? In the ninth chapter of Acts we saw the dramatic calling of the Apostle Paul into ministry. In Act 9: 36-43 we saw Peter raise Dorcas from the dead. We would all have to agree that these are examples of God’s calling and gifting. But some would say, “Yeah, but that was when the church was just starting and Jesus needed some special guys.”

When you showed up last Sunday for service, did someone greet you at the door? Was there coffee ready for you before service and doughnuts after? How about once the service was started, was there a worship team to lead you in

songs to the Lord? Followed by a teaching? All of these are evidence that the gifts of the Spirit are alive and working in the lives of God’s people. Each one of these people at one time in their lives felt a calling on their lives and stepped out, in faith, to serve the body. Are these special Christians? Are they chosen for that special work? Yes, but don’t get the wrong idea.

“But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty...” 1Cor 1:27

God uses the foolish and weak so He receives the glory and not man. If we think that God needs our skills to serve Him, we are sourly mistaken; Romans 11:35, “Who has ever given to God, that God should repay him?” God doesn’t need the prideful. He might use us to show how NOT to do something, but we have missed His will, completely. Many, on the other hand, feel too weak in their faith or are just afraid they can’t serve or be used. Isn’t that exactly the heart God desires?

“...’God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble.’” James 4:6

“There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all...”

1Corinthians 12: 4-7

Each of us is given a gift to be used to edify the body of Christ. We all serve

the same God and are empowered by the same Spirit for the profit of the same Body. God has equipped His Church as He pleased, but it is our responsibility to activate the gifts that has been bestowed upon us. We must step out in faith to find the gift that has been given us. Seek to serve and please God and He will direct your path.

Trust in the LORD with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths. Proverbs 3:5-6

Harry Ironside simply put it this way, “ Do not be content to come to meeting and just be a spiritual sponge. Fill up, and then let the blessed Lord do some squeezing. Give it out to somebody else, and then you will be carrying out the true principle of the New Testament ministry.”

Missions Update from Kochi, India

Greetings from Kochi, India,

Now thanks be to God Who always leads us in triumph in Christ, and through us diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place (2 Cor.2:14)

We give thanks to God for all of our brothers and sisters of Calvary Chapel Bible Fellowship for your continued prayers and support to the Ministry that God has entrusted to us here in Kochi, India.

The ministry is going on well by the grace of God. As usual we visit Kunnukara village every Tuesday. This week we visited 35 homes and distributed tracts. We were invited into two homes, both of which were Hindu families. We presented the gospel to them, and one lady was saved, the others gave us a patient hearing but did not make any commitment. We are glad though that during the past three months about 34 souls were saved from that area, and we were able to visit 100 homes. A few Bibles also were distributed.

Evangelism in our locality takes places on Thursdays and about two souls are saved every week. We do encounter some hard-hearted people who abuse us with filthy language, sometimes just short of physical abuse. At such times we rejoice as Jesus said in Matt.5:11,12 "Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you".

The Saturday Worship and Bible fellowship is going on well, we have around 20 to 25 people joining us. Our vision is to have at least a 100 people joining us on the terrace of our house. May God bring it to pass, Amen!

Antony is continuing with the Thursday night and Friday morning

home Bible studies, going through the book of Ephesians and gospel of Luke.

The Sunday morning Worship service conducted at our home have just the four of us in attendance, but we believe that it is God Who will give the increase and bring to pass a Calvary in our area.

Antony had attended an Intercessory Fasting Prayer for three days in another city, the theme of which was "Evangelization of India."

We do need your earnest prayers for our ministry, and we once again thank each one of you for your prayers and support towards our ministry.

Threatened by military annihilation, economic ruin, devastating famines and then scattered to the far corners of the globe – there surely has been so other people that have endured like the Jews.

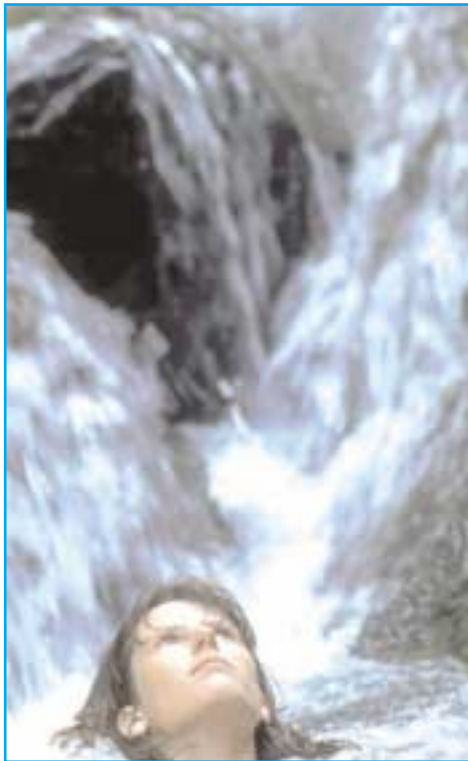
Modern history records the continuing saga and the formation of the State of Israel in 1948, while witnessing the birth of a long held dream for the Jews to stand once again on the soil of their Promised Land. One that has come with it's price, one being paid for beyond the value of money.

Woven into the very fabric of this nation's history has been the greatest struggle of all...between the Jews and their God and ultimately for them to realize and accept His Son Yeshua, "The tested stone which God laid in Zion" (Isa. 28:16 and Ps. 118:22-27).

"This stone which the builders, Israel, rejected has become the Chief Corner Stone. Israel stumbled over the stone – not that they should fall – God forbid, but in order for God to show mercy to the Gentiles (Rom. 11:11-15, 25-32) that they can take part in the Covenant and the hope of the promised kingdom. (Dan. 7:13-14, Acts 1:6, Eph. 2:12 and Rev. 21:10-14). Thus, the mercy of God will be for all ... Jews and Gentiles alike and God's glory alone..." "but first to the Jew" (Rom. 11:29).

As a young man, I asked myself, why to the Jew first?. Is it because they are more holy or righteous? Not at all. But they are God's chosen people and that "gift and calling of

Help — I'm Sinking!

Notice it was when Peter took his eyes off of Jesus and onto the circumstances that he started to sink.

It is at those times that we cling to the Word of God which encourages and reminds us that we are not alone. There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it. 1 Corinthians 10:13

It is a comfort for us to know that our loving Father has His eyes on us. He will not have us encounter more than we can bear.

There is a great picture story that fits this Scripture. In the late 19th century, merchants were loading British ships so full that the ships sank in heavy seas going to and from the New World. As a result, Samuel Plimsoll initiated a bill before the British Parliament to require all ships to have a horizontal line painted on their hulls to show how heavily they might be loaded with safety. This line even today is known as the Plimsoll line on seagoing vessels.

In the same way, God paints a Plimsoll line on every believer. While a believer can be heavily burdened, he will never be overcome by any weight of life that will cause him to sink spiritually. God will never allow anything into a believer's life that will force him to sin.

It is important to note that the Scripture says that we can escape the temptation to sin but not necessarily escape from the situation. Thus, when a believer sins, it is not because circumstances are too much for him to bear. Scripture is very clear on this

point. The reason is that the believer sins because he chooses to do so. Paul spoke eloquently about this in Romans 7:

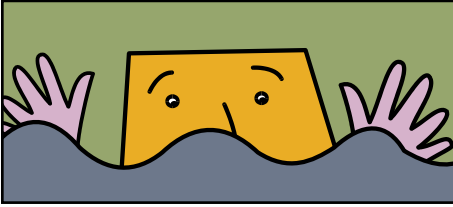
For we know that the law is spiritual: but I am carnal, sold under sin. For that which I do I allow not: for what I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that do I. If then I do that which I would not, I consent unto the law that it is good. Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to perform that which is good I find not. For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do. Now if I do that I would not, it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me. For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

So now that I have fallen short again and done that thing which causes my conscience to feel sinful, what do I do?

Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. 1 Timothy 3:9

Each one of us has felt that sinking feeling at some point in our Christian walk. The Apostle Peter had a similar experience according to the Gospels.

And in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went unto them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, It is a spirit; and they cried out for fear. But straightway Jesus spake unto them, saying, Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid. And Peter answered Him and said, Lord, if it be Thou, bid me come unto Thee on the water. And He said, Come. And when Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus. But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me. And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt? Matthew 14:25-31



The Christian has the choice to stop the sin, repent of it, confess it, and ask God's forgiveness for it. We can be sure of this when we read 1 John 1:7-10:

But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanseth us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.

This is all well and good, but what can the believer do to avoid repeating the same old sin all over again? As usual, we find the answer in the Word of God.

Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things. Philippians 4:8

If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with Him in glory. Col 3:1-4

But now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth. Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: Put on therefore, as the elect

of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him. Col 3:8-17

So we can see that trials and temptations are not obstacles to spiritual growth when you respond to them in a Biblical manner. God allows them in our lives, so that we may become mature in the Word and a blessing to Him.

And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose. For whom He did foreknow, He also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. Romans 8:28-29

My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.

James 1:2-4

So the next time you have that sinking feeling, check out your tummy and see just where the water is lapping at your Plimsoll line. God sees it, too, and will bail you out if you choose to let Him. May all your voyages with Jesus be with a dry bilge and the wind at your back.

Romans 5:15 But not as the offence, so also is the free gift. For if through the offence of one many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many.

Romans 5:16-18 And not as it was by one that sinned, so is the gift: for the judgment was by one to condemnation, but the free gift is of many offences unto justification. For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.). Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life.

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Eph 2:8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:

Eph 4:7 But unto every one of us is given grace according to the measure of the gift of Christ.

2 Timothy 1:6 Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.

James 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.

Friday Night Men's Fellowship

When asked to write a brief description of the Friday Night Men's Fellowship for "The Fellowship Newsletter," I was thrilled. What a joy it is to see men coming together to grow in the Lord. God is richly blessing His Word as we come together every Friday to learn more about Jesus and become more like Him.

The desire of the men's fellowship is to simply provide men the opportunity to grow in their walk and apply Biblical principles to real issues of life. This ministry was born out of Pastor Manny's vision to provide a time of study and fellowship designed specifically for men who were currently experiencing trials: an end-of-the-week fill up in the Word of God! We've been having such a wonderful time. We are seeing men's lives change - to God be the glory. God's will for us is to know Him intimately and to be conformed into His image. Peter encourages us in 2 Peter to add to our faith specific qualities that reflect the likeness of Christ. On Fridays, we continually reinforce the necessity to "add to our faith."

God wants to form Christ in us so that outwardly we can reflect Him in all that we do, and inwardly we can commune and fellowship with Him. Chuck Missler said, "In other words,

God doesn't just want us to be a revelation of Christ, He wants us to be a reproduction of Christ - an extension of His love."

For many months, the ministry focus has been confronting tough problems caused by compromise. We have discovered no one wakes up one morning and says, "Praise the Lord. This looks like a great day to sin and backslide." Rather, we all desire to live an effective Christian life and be victorious, but we find ourselves in a continuing battle between the flesh and the spirit (Galatians 5). Men's minds are repeatedly assaulted with hundreds of ways to compromise - we take a little off here and a little off there, until Biblical truth and values are completely eroded. One pastor believes that this is the greatest concern for men in our age - compromise: "With each small step, each subtle compromise, we are drawn further from Christ and closer to the abyss of spiritual failure. Then there is that last little push, that last little compromise, the one you can't pull out of."

At the Calvary Men's Conference at Anaheim Convention Center on October 20th, Pastor Chuck said, "Drifting away may be one of the greatest problems that Christians face. Sometimes it's easier to say 'NO' to the

big sin issues and not recognize that we're drifting away from our personal relationship with the Lord. The picture that we're given in this verse ("Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away," Hebrews 2: 1) is of a ship drifting past its place of safety and heading towards disaster because the ship's captain wasn't paying attention to where he was going. He wasn't focused on the course that he should have been on. And that can happen to us if we start drifting away from the truths of God's Word. That's when we find ourselves caught up in the 'riptides' of the world and headed into deep water. We need to 'take heed lest we fall.' Let us purpose in our hearts to 'STAY ON COURSE', focused on the cross so we can say, like Paul, we have run the race with endurance and finished well."

Laying a firm foundation in God's Word will enable men to stand strong in this world and to be Godly leaders in their families. 1 Timothy 6: 19 exhorts us to "Store up a good foundation for the time to come, that we may lay hold on eternal life." We are storing up a good foundation through the study of the Word and persisting in prayer, and seeing men encouraged and equipped to fight the good fight of faith. The goal of Friday Night Fellowship is to help

men grow in their God-given roles, and to encourage and exhort one another towards maturity in Christ. We are not only being grounded in God's Word, but we are building relationships with other men, and serving at the Church. The Psalmist said, *"Behold, how good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity, for it is there (in fellowship) the Lord commands the blessing - life evermore," Psalm 133: 1-3.*

When I see what's happening in the lives of men - broken relationships being healed, marriages restored, and suffering turned to joy - I rejoice but often wonder why some men resign from taking the initiative to come out to men's fellowship. I want to encourage all the men of Calvary to plug in to Monday or Friday men's groups to grow together. Solomon wrote, "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work: if one man falls down, his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up," Ecclesiastes 4: 9,10. Praise God the men of Calvary are accepting the challenge that the Holy Spirit is bringing into our lives: "So be strong, show yourself a man, and observe what the Lord your God requires..." 1 Kings 2: 2.

We are currently in a series on Prayer, covering such topics as the Purpose of Prayer, the Privilege of Prayer, Prevailing Prayer, Persistence in Prayer, and the Promises in Prayer. It has been such a wonderful series and we are learning so much. The men are recognizing that praying 'in the name of Jesus' is not something we do; it's something we are. And, that the purpose of prayer is not to get man's will done in Heaven, but to get God's will done on earth. We are all learning so much and I know we are getting closer to Jesus. Praise God.

Upcoming Studies

The next series will be, "Jihad in America." Most Americans, and even most Christians, have no real awareness

of the nature of Islam: its origin, its agenda, and its methods. This will be a challenging study, and one we are looking forward to.

The Danger of Compromise

Sadly, this is how most people want it today. They want to go to church - when they get around to it. They certainly want to go to heaven, but they still want to live in sin. They want to party and sin and commit immorality, lie when necessary, cheat if they have to, steal if it suits them, and hate and get revenge when someone crosses them.

It is the idea of sinning to your heart's content, telling yourself God will understand. If you think you can sin to your heart's content without repercussions, and if you think you can go out and break the commandments of God over and over because you're an exception to the rule, then you are deceiving yourself.

I am not suggesting that a Christian will not sin. The Bible clearly says, "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1: 8). But there is a big difference between the person who sins, is sorry for it, and doesn't want to keep doing it, and the person who continually, willfully, habitually sins over and over again and then says, "It is okay. God will forgive me."

The Bible says, "*Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?*" (Romans 6: 1, NIV). The devil introduced compromise into the church of Pergamos and he will introduce it into the lives of people today.

If you look at the times in your life when you have fallen into sin, you could probably trace it back to a series of missteps - small compromises you made that led to the big compromise that led to your fall. And as compromise finds its way into the church, it weakens us. The church of Christ patronized is the church

of Christ impure. We lose our effectiveness in this world. We lose our effectiveness as individuals as well.

I am not suggesting that we be holier-than-thou hypocrites. Instead, we should live in such a way that unbelievers could look at us and say, "There is something different about that person. Something that is desirable, something admirable." They may laugh at you at times, but deep in their hearts they may deeply respect you. The compromising person, on the other hand, reaches no one.

Compromise begins with leaving your first love for Jesus Christ, which leads to compromise, which leads ultimately to immorality, idolatry, and other sins.

Show me a person who is not living in close fellowship with God and I will show you a person who is on the way to bigger problems. It is only a matter of time. The best antidote to the allurements and temptations of this world is a passionate love relationship with Jesus Christ.

If there is a breakdown in your relationship with God, it is only a matter of time until compromises start making their way into your life, until you start lowering your standards here and there. Keep your guard up. Stay close to Jesus, let the fire of the first love burn brightly, and you will be strong. I can't promise that you will be sin-free. But you will have the power and resolve you need to live a life that pleases God.

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Have you ever heard the story of the guy who could not decide what side he wanted to fight for during the Civil War? He put on the coat of the North and the trousers of the South, and guess what? He got shot at from both sides! This is what happens to the compromiser, the person who tries to live in two worlds. It's one miserable place to be.

Sadly, there are many in the church today that live a compromised life.

The great British preacher, G. Campbell Morgan, once said, "It is a remarkable thing that the church of Christ persecuted has been the church of Christ pure. On the other hand, the church of Christ patronized has been the church of Christ impure."

The Bible gives us an example in Revelation 2 of such a church: it was Pergamos, located in Pergamum, the capital of Asia Minor. Known for its rampant idolatry, Pergamum housed the altar of Zeus and was the center of Caesar worship. Idolatry, wickedness, and sexual immorality were commonplace. The sin of Pergamum was its toleration of evil, a sort of have-your-cake-and-eat-it-too philosophy.

It's Monday evening after a long day. The men are coming through the door; they seem upbeat, and though some are tired, they all seem excited about tonight's gathering. Some come in groups, some one at a time. There is always a little light-hearted jabbing, a skill friends practice whenever they get together. There are snacks around the room and a couple of pitchers full of cool liquid. Is it Monday Night football? No? Well then, what could these men possibly be so excited about?

I'm glad you asked. These fellow believers are assembling for what is often called *koinonia*, or fellowship. At the appropriate time, the guys take their seats, and the worship begins. Men's voices ring out in praise and thanksgiving to their Savior. As the world around them slips away, they draw closer to their Lord. At the end of a sweet time of worship and praise, the Bibles are opened and after a prayer for divine guidance, these men listen and share truth straight from the

Word of God.

Some of these men are mature in Christ while some are new in their faith. Many are somewhere in between. There are questions, and there are answers, and there are questions that do not get answered that evening. But the Bible declares, "As iron sharpens iron, so a man sharpens the countenance of his friend." These men are of kindred spirit. They are following Jesus. Acts 2:42 tells us about the early church. *"And they were steadfastly continuing in the teachings of the apostles and in fellowship, and the breaking of bread, and prayers."* On Monday evenings at the church, men are encouraged, exhorted, educated and drawn closer to the Living God, to their Lord and Savior by the Holy Spirit. 1 John 1:3, *"that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ."*

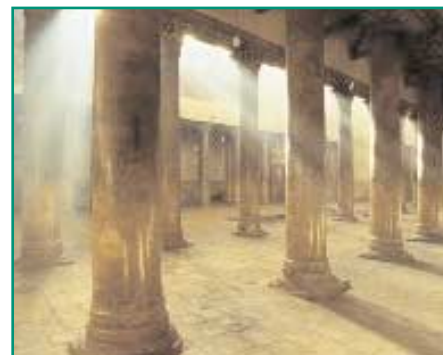
In Bethlehem

God is irrevocable" Rom. 11:29). It is because the Jews stumbled over the stone, Yeshua, and were like branches broken away from the olive tree, that God chose to graft the "wild olive" branches (Gentile believers) onto the tree to provoke Israel to jealousy and turn them toward Yeshua, their salvation (Rom. 11:17-26). Yet, it is always to the Jews first that God offers His loving hand of reconciliation. Salvation has come to us all through the Jews (John 4:22) Jesus, the Son of God, our Lord and Savior came as a Jew, a fact that some Christians fail to recognize.

Because of God's great act of grace and mercy towards us, it is our responsibility and loving duty to show mercy and grace to Israel and actively proclaim the Gospel within the borders of that nation and wherever Jewish people are gathered. They desperately need to hear the trumpet of salvation heralding the Name of Yeshua. "For everyone who calls upon the Name of the Lord will be saved...For Faith comes by what is heard and what is heard comes by preaching of Christ" (Rom. 10:13-17).

He Came

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. John 3:16

Babies are so cute! The first time I held my daughter, I felt like I was holding the most delicate and precious gift that I could ever be presented with. I held other babies and felt all warm inside, and then my grandson came along, and I was in love with motherhood again. There's just something about babies that make our eyes sparkle and our hearts tingle. I see it in other women *and* men. We begin to "goo-ga" in high pitched noises, and we cross our eyes and contort our faces — all to please these tiny little gifts from heaven.

If I'm not careful, I look for the tingles and sparkles when I think of the Baby placed in the manger about 2000 years ago. I romanticize His birth and forget that He was born in a town that was probably very noisy from all the people who had been ordered to go there to register for the census. It was so crowded that there was no room for a pregnant teenager to have her baby — other than in a smelly, filthy stable, which was probably in a dark cave. And the only place she had to lay Him was in a feeding trough (I like to think of it in a more comfy term, "the manger").

In all of this poverty and humble beginnings, the presentation of this Baby to the world was of the highest order; no king could have topped it. For the stars shone brightly, and the heavens rang forth, as a multitude of angels announced His most holy birth and praised God, saying:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men. Luke 2:14

For several months, I have been reflecting on Romans 12:1-2, trying to understand how I could present my body as a living sacrifice:

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

The people in the Christmas story are examples of living sacrifices, for they presented their bodies to God for Him to use as He would see fit. Old, barren Elizabeth yielded her body and spirit to believe the vision of Zecharias. And this old



couple devoted the next few years to bringing up John the Baptist as a Nazarite, no small task. He would become the forerunner of Jesus, encouraging everyone to repent; he announced Jesus, and he baptized Jesus.

The young, virgin Mary and her fiance yielded their bodies and reputations in obedience to the will of God. They presented their Baby to God as well, for when the time of purification was completed after the birth,

... they brought Him to Jerusalem, to present Him to the Lord; (As it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord;) Luke 2:22-23

Mary and Joseph's lives would never be what they had planned, for they would soon flee to Egypt to save the life of this special Baby who was God in the flesh. Yet, they gave what they had, their bodies, their reputations, their livelihood, their all to follow the will of God.

This Baby Jesus presented Himself as a living sacrifice. He is the Reason for the Celebration and the Reason for the Season! For His birth was a royal birth, a most holy birth. This Baby was going to turn the world upside down with His teachings, His miracles, His life, and His death. He came to present Himself to the world and all His Kingdom with it. In His life, He presented Himself transparently, humbly, and lovingly. He came to show "The Way." He gave His all, even His life.
